The Centre offers a number of programs and services, as well as an opportunity for membership in our growing Interprofessional Collaboration (IPC) Community of Practice.


## INTERPROFESSIONAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM

### What is the meaning of Interprofessional Education?

*"Interprofessional education occurs when two or more professionals learn about, from and with each other to enable effective collaboration and improve health outcomes."*

World Health Organization, 2010

The IPE Curriculum is based on a core competency framework that encompasses a learning continuum, moving towards the goal of optimizing the provision of interprofessional collaborative care. The framework incorporates 3 key constructs; Communication, Collaboration and Values and Ethics. Each construct outlines core competencies that students will gain as they move across the learning continuum, through Exposure (introductory), Immersion (development and professional placement) and ultimately, Competence (Entry – to – Practice).



### How will the Interprofessional Education Curriculum benefit me?

Interprofessional Education is a worldwide initiative aiming to increase the standards of patient/client care and employee satisfaction. The skills that students learn during this curriculum will not only assist in future practice, but will also increase opportunities moving into the work force. Upon successful completion of the IPE Curriculum requirements, students will receive a letter of completion that can be incorporated into their portfolios.

### How many sessions do I need to complete in order to graduate from the IPE Curriculum?

There are eleven health sciences programs at UT involved in the IPE Curriculum; Occupational Therapy, Speech - Language Pathology, Physical Therapy, Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing, Medical Radiation Sciences, Social Work, Physician Assistant and Pharmacy. Each program has determined the number of core and elective sessions' students are required to participate in to complete the IPE Curriculum.
